YAYASAN MENDAKI AND GLOBAL RADIANCE GROUP EXTEND PARTNERSHIP AND INTRODUCE NEW SCHOLARSHIP FOR MARITIME AND ENGINEERING STUDENTS

Friday, 9 January 2026 - Yayasan MENDAKI (“MENDAKI”) and Global Radiance Group of Maritime Companies (“GRG”) have signed a five-year Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to extend the Education Trust Fund – Global Radiance Group Bursary and introduce a new scholarship, the Yayasan MENDAKI – Global Radiance Group Scholarship.

GRG has committed \$100,000 from 2026 and 2030 to empower Malay/Muslim students pursuing careers in the maritime and engineering sectors. Of this, \$70,000 will fund bursaries for 40 Malay/Muslim Polytechnic and Institutes of Technical Education (ITE) students pursuing full-time Maritime or Engineering studies. Each year, four Polytechnic students will receive \$2,000 each, while four ITE students will receive \$1,500 each.

In addition, \$30,000 will support a newly established scholarship programme, benefiting 10 Polytechnic students over five years. Each scholarship recipient will receive \$3,000 in recognition of their outstanding academic results, exemplary conduct, and leadership qualities.

The MOA was signed at Yayasan MENDAKI Headquarters by Mr Feroz Akber, Chief Executive Officer of Yayasan MENDAKI, and Mr Abdul Lateef Siddiqui, Chairman and Managing Director of Global Radiance Group of Maritime Companies. The signing was witnessed by Dr Noraslinda Zuber, Deputy Chief Officer of Yayasan MENDAKI,

and Mdm Nooraine Minhaj, Senior Human Resource Manager of Global Radiance Group of Maritime Companies.

GRG has been a donor since 2020, contributing to MENDAKI's bursary awards. Since then, their contribution has benefitted more than 200 ITE and Polytechnic students. Mr Abdul Lateef Siddiqui said: "I strongly believe in giving back to society. That is why we support education, because its impact goes far beyond the classroom. When a child is educated, an entire generation is uplifted, a community is strengthened, and a nation moves forward. I firmly believe in teaching how to catch a fish rather than merely giving a fish to eat, because education creates dignity, independence, and lasting change."

Mr Feroz said: "We appreciate GRG's continued support and expanded commitment to include a new scholarship. This partnership empowers our students with opportunities to excel in their education and future careers. With the support, more Malay/Muslim students will benefit over the next five years, building on the success we have seen since 2020. MENDAKI remains committed to provide continued opportunities for our Malay/Muslim community."

A past-recipient of the Education Trust Fund – Global Radiance Group Bursary in 2025, Muhammad Nur Iman, 18 years old, Year 2 student in Higher Nitec in Sports Management shared: "The ETF-GRG Bursary has eased my financial concerns and allowed me to focus on my studies with greater confidence. It has also inspired me to give back to the community by coaching younger students. I am deeply grateful for the support. It is motivating to see more students benefiting from this bursary."
